Sign up for free holiday clubs this winter

Families are encouraged to sign up now for free holiday clubs running in Leicestershire over the Christmas holiday period.

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) is a free holiday programme for primary and secondary children aged five to 16, in receipt of benefits-related free school meals, funded by the government.

Leicestershire County Council is working with Active Together to co-ordinate the winter HAF programme which will be delivered at venues across the county by schools, voluntary and community organisations, childcare providers and sports clubs.

Children and young people can access up to four holiday club sessions (16 hours) over the Christmas holidays - free of charge.

The sessions will offer a variety of fun activities, including sports, music, arts and exciting opportunities to learn and develop new skills, alongside a nutritious meal each day.

Some holiday clubs will also offer fee paying places for children and young people not eligible for free school meals, and families who are eligible for Universal Credit may be able to claim back up to 85% of their childcare costs.

Leicestershire SEND Hub is the Parent Carer Forum for children and young people age 0-25 with special educational needs and disabilities.

- We participated in the peer challenge review/mock inspection for the Local Authority and strategic partners.
- We are currently planning to join other future events such as Local Offer Roadshows.
- In the spring we will be hosting a large-scale SEND conference. This exciting project will be for parent carers plus professionals with keynote speakers and workshops

The Carers Centre is a well-known local charity supporting unpaid carers across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland.

Our services include:

- Helpline Service for advice and support in all areas of caring
- Advocacy and Support Project
- Health and Well-Being Activities
- Social and Fun Sessions
- Crafty Carers and Book Club
- Training and Information Sessions

Advocacy and Support Project

Parents/carers of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities can access our self-advocacy and support groups, known as the Together We Care Groups. These are relaxed, welcoming sessions which at present are meeting over Zoom - face-toface sessions in the New Year. One group is on a Tuesday mornings.with one monthly evening session.

At our Together We Care Groups you can:

- Meet other parents/carers to share experiences
- Gain skills, develop confidence to deal with challenges you may face
- Find out about services for you and your child
- Learn how to get your point across in meetings with professionals

The Group has information sessions on topics including:

- Accessing support from Children's Social Care
- Obtaining a Carer's Assessment
- · Dealing with difficult behaviours
- Dealing with issues around food
- Supporting young people through puberty
- Transition from children's to adult services
- · Well-being

We regularly have guest speakers and recently we have had speakers from:

- The Speech and Language Therapy Service
- Local Offer Leicester
- The Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS)

We also offer opportunities to have your say about services you may receive.

Vista's Active Early Years eye health project will return

Vista, local sight loss charity is pleased to announce that their Active Early Years eye health project will resume providing free training and resource packs to Early Years Practitioners based in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland.

The pack, known previously as 'Let's Get Moving', is currently being renamed and redesigned as 'Active Eyes'. Active Eyes is a practical resource which helps Early Years Practitioners understand the need for observing children's developing eyesight and guiding parents/carers to take children for regular eye tests. It also comes with a training session that helps to give early years settings and practitioners a chance to understand the need for early intervention.

Since 2018, before Covid, over 100 packs and training sessions were delivered through the Leicester Leicestershire and Rutland area, and now that we are coming back out of the pandemic, we would love to double that number by summer 2022.

A child minder who took part in the training in January 2020 said:

"Coming on the course gave me the confidence to know what I was observing and the knowledge on where to direct the family. Initially the health visitor had advised to wait until they start school, which I knew in my heart was not the right thing to do." The Local Offer – a look back over the year

Although we weren't able to get the Local Offer out and about in the community, we have made quite a few exciting developments with the Local Offer during 2021. We have added new content throughout the year such as the Early Years Home Learning Packs and the My Journey to Adulthood Information Pack. We have also revised our SEN Support Handbook which is not only for school staff but also really useful for parent carers to enable them be as informed as possible.

We have also continued to grow our Facebook Community and appreciate every like, share and comment we receive as this helps the information we share reach many more families and professionals.

Although we have not been able to get our Roadshows "Back on the Road" we have been busy working in the background and are excited for them to begin again for 2022 (We have everything crossed for a smooth return!) During 2021 we have had 42,035 web visits to the Local Offer and 128,142 views of Local Offer web pages and although we know we have very high numbers of people viewing our information we know we still need to do more in increasing peoples awareness of the Local Offer and how it can help. That's why we have developed a short animation with our Local Offer Colleagues in Leicester City and Rutland which we will be sharing very soon! We have also used Facebook to target communities who may not be aware of the Local Offer and created our E-Flyer earlier in the year. We have also visited lots of internal departments within Leicestershire County Council to help raise practitioner's awareness of the Local Offer so they too know where to signpost families to. New Communication and Interaction Surgeries

The Specialist Teaching Service's Autism Outreach Team is offering all Leicestershire schools access to a 'C&I Surgery' via Microsoft Teams to explore the needs of pupils with Communication and Interaction needs (who may or may not have a diagnosis of Autism) and to identify strategies to support these pupils.

These 45-minute surgeries are open for schools to discuss pupils who may have a diagnosis of Autism (and are not already open to AOT), be on the Neurodevelopmental Pathway or where school may have concerns about the pupil's C&I needs, which may include difficulties with social understanding and communication, flexibility, information processing and sensory processing.

C&I surgeries will provide an opportunity for discussion around pupil needs, to explore strategies, interventions and to access advice and signposting without making a referral to Autism Outreach. This is to promote early intervention and support schools in implementing a graduated response.

Written Statement of Action

Following on from the SEND inspection in February 2020 and the local area receiving a Written Statement of Action, partners across Leicestershire have contributed to developments outlined in the Written Statement of Action. Progress is rated as Blue, Red, Amber, Green (BRAG), and after each formal monitoring meeting, shared on the Local Offer:

Feedback from the Department for Education regional Adviser and NHS England / Improvement regional Adviser has been that the local area continues to progress at a good rate against the two areas identified within the Written Statement of Action:

- Lack of a joint commissioning strategy
- Quality of EHC plans



Developments to date include:

- An LLR SEND Joint Commissioning Strategy https://www.leicester.gov. uk/your-council/policiesplans-and-strategies/ social-care-and-education/ special-educationalneeds-and-disabilitysend-joint-commissioningstrategy-2021-2024/
- A co-designed Neurodevelopmental Pathway model ready for the implementation phase
- Introduction of a Keyworker programme that will support children and young people with a learning disability, autism or both that are at risk of being admitted to hospital
- The publication of a SEN Support Handbook, providing guidance and resources in supporting SEN pupils in schools


- Launch of a Learning Platform for school, containing video's and resource son SEND themes
- The restructure of the SENA service to operate a case management model
- Implementation of a Decision to Assess Panel to complement the SEN Panel
- Introduction of a multi-agency EHC plan audit on a bi-monthly basis to inform learning

The focus for the next formal meeting will be reporting on the lived experience by parents/carers and children and young people and considering our partners perspective on the developments in the Written Statement of Action. The SEND and Inclusion Board will continue to monitor the Written Statement of Action at a local level.

SEND and Inclusion Board development session

The SEND and Inclusion Board are the strategic partnership body that provides the steer on SEND developments across Leicestershire. Partners include representatives from education, social care (children and adult) and SEN transport from the local authority, senior managers from the Clinical Commissioning Groups and Leicestershire Partnership Trust, the Designated Clinical Officer, schools and colleges, Prevent team and the Leicestershire Parent Carer Forum (Leicestershire SEND Hub).

The SEND and Inclusion Strategy prioritises improvement across SEND services and is monitored by the SEND and Inclusion Board. The strategy comprises five priority areas:



A development session was held on the 1st and 5th November to celebrate progress so far and refresh the action plan for year 2 of the strategy. Members heard feedback from parent/carers on Early Years pathways, how the Local Offer website should look, the new provision at Foxfields and outcomes within EHC plans. Video's were shown on the new Post-16 building at Maplewell Hall and Tom's work placement at Geosynthetics (article within the summer SEND Newsletter). Other developments showcased included the launch of the Learning Platform for schools, holding a range of video's and resources on SEND themes; developments in the Young Adult Disability team; the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland SEND Joint Commissioning Strategy; the new model for a Neurodevelopmental Pathway; the work of the Leicestershire SEND Hub and the range of training and resources being developed and shared across the partnership.

Information from the sessions will inform the next phase of the SEND and Inclusion Strategy action plan in preparation for year 2.



Joint LLR SEND Commissioning Strategy launched

In September our Joint LLR SEND Commissioning Strategy, 2021-24, which has been developed by Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Councils and the Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCG's) for the area, went live!

The strategy contains a high-level vision for joint commissioning that 'we will work together across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland to improve the outcomes for children and young people with SEND' and a set of priorities for the focus of joint work in the coming 3 years. These priorities focus on a range of areas including, transitions, quality, planning and health provisions. To celebrate delivery of the strategy and to share with partners and children and families some of the work that has already been done against the priorities, a formal launch event was held on 29th November 2021. At this event our lead member for Children and Family Services in Leicestershire, Mrs D Taylor, spoke about the strategy and what we hope it will mean for children and families in Leicestershire, Leicester City and Rutland. Cllr Taylor was joined by other representatives for Leicester City Council and Rutland County Council and representatives from health and there was discussion about what has been achieved so far and what our next steps will be to ensure that the priorities in the strategy are delivered in the next 3 years.
