## From Mrs Cumberlidge...

Please see the dates on the left hand side. As mentioned in the last newsletter we will be writing reports for the children.

We have developed a new report format for the end of year reports which we hope will give you a lot of information about how your child is progressing following a second lot of mini assessments/quizzes that they will be doing at some point after half-term. We will then follow these with the opportunity for you to meet virtually if you wish to follow anything up for a parents evening. We are unable to do this face to face unfortunately so have investigated various systems that are internet based to complete this exercise. I will forward further details after half-term about the system we have chosen. You will be able to book your appointment/s online and will then at that time login in either on a computer/laptop/tablet or phone that has access to the internet. Your teacher will then have a timed session to talk to you at your appointment time, this will be between 5 & 8 minutes we think but we will confirm this after set up. The appointment will only be available at that set time so please do not be late or else your allocated slot will be gone and the screen will cut off when the time has expired. Only one appointment will be available per child so all parents/carers will be on the same appointment and the parent that books it will need to share the information with the other parent. Instructions on how to do this will follow. It also means that if one parent is at home and one is at work they can still both join.

A letter for Year 6 will follow regarding the Leavers Party which we are still hoping can go ahead. The children met outside with two fundraisers to discuss their ideas yesterday afternoon!

## Leavers / New Appointments

As I mentioned in the last newsletter Mrs Matthews wished to retire at the end of this term in July if we could find a replacement for her. Since then we have had another teacher secure a job for next year to move onto pastures new – Miss Rojahn is relocating with her boyfriend down to London and has secured a lovely new job teaching in a Primary School that she says feels like Huncote! I am sure you will join me in wishing her the best of luck and I know she will definitely be keeping in touch with us all 😊.

Miss Dow our LSA in KS1 has decided to take the next big step in her career working with children and has gained a place on a course to complete her teacher training. This is fantastic news that we are all very proud of, and it is indicative of the children and staff here at Huncote that she has worked with, making her now feel she can take that next exciting step – good luck!

This week we have been interviewing to appointment Mrs Matthews and Miss Rojahn's replacements. We had an amazing response to both adverts with lots and lots of people wanting to come and look round the school for both jobs and this also resulted in lots of applications. We interviewed 5 applicants for each job and it was a long grueling day for them.

I am very pleased to say Miss Lucie Caunt has been appointed as a class teacher to start next academic year and is very excited to be joining our school. She has taught in both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 at Overdale Junior School and Woolden Hill Primary School.

I am also very pleased to say that Mrs Sally Houghton has been appointed as the Deputy Head. Mrs Houghton is at present an Assistant Head at Rushey Mead Primary School. She is an experienced teacher having taught in a variety of schools for 11 years, across a range of year groups and key stages as well as having a proven track record of driving whole school improvement. She is also a Mum to two children.

In our next newsletter I hope to include a short paragraph from each of them to introduce themselves. We are also hoping that both of them will be able to join us again in school before the end of this school year. It also means that Mrs Matthews will be leaving us on Friday July 9<sup>th</sup>.

We still have to work out and piece together our teaching team in terms of who is teaching where next year. However, we do know that the EYFS or Reception Class (Oak Class) will be taught by Miss Nutt next year. This is so that we can get started on moving forwards with inducting the new children the best we can again and make arrangements for the children starting. Before Miss Nutt came to Huncote Primary she taught EYFS for a number of years as a lead EYFS teacher and a Local Authority Moderator for EYFS in other schools in the county. She is very much looking forward to moving to EYFS again after a five years of teaching Year 1 & 2 here at Huncote. For those with children starting in EYFS next year we will be in touch very soon after the half-term to let you know any details and arrangements that need sorting.

Finally .... details were sent out yesterday on Class Dojo regarding how to contact school for Covid-19 reasons throughout the half-term, and also how we will contact you if needed for track and trace purposes.
